
HOW TO FIND OUT ABOUT ASSUMED KNOWLEDGE

Assumed knowledge is all the things your teachers assume you know *before* you do their course.


- 1. Make a list of topics and concepts.
- For each topic and concept:
 Write down what you already KNOW.
 Write down what you WANT to know.
- 3. For each topic and concept, find out everything you want to know
- 4. For each topic and concept, write notes about what you have learned.
